(EXP), she worked as the Laboratory and Project Manager for Adventus Remediation Technologies in Mississauga, and taught at the University of Guelph. To date, she has been involved in over 100 environmental projects including environmental site assessments, soil and water remediation, toxicity testing and degradation and fate studies of chemical contaminants, for various clients across North America and in Europe.
