


#### Jack Winram MEIA Executive Director

# TREASURER REPORT

#### Ashlee Davis MEIA Treasurer

2019 is best described as a year of transition for Manitoba Environmental Industries Association (MEIA).

- In addition to MEIA's focus on serving its members, the organization was appointed the exciting role to represent the Natural Resources, Energy & Environment sector under Manitoba's Sector Council Program. With this role, funding from Manitoba Economic Development and Training (formerly Manitoba Education and Training) increased to \$375,600 for 2019. Funding until March 2023 has been secured up to \$447,900 annually (prior to any future impacts from COVID-19, which are unknown at this time).
- We moved into a new office space in November 2019 to allow for growth in our new role.
- We welcomed a new team during 2019 and early 2020, which includes our Office and Finance Administrator and Programming and Communications Coordinator in 2019 and our new permanent Executive Director in January 2020.

With all the changes in 2019, much of our focus was on the administrative operations of MEIA and adapting to our new role as both sector council representative and member association. However, among all the changes, we still delivered many professional development programs and events for our members. Key financial highlights for the year are as follows:

- ◆ Total revenues for 2019 were \$505,600, consisting of \$375,600 from our core funding, \$50,300 from membership dues (including student chapter memberships), \$69,200 from professional development programs and events and \$10,500 from other grants.
- Total expenses for 2019 were \$388,100, consisting of \$97,200 directly related to delivering professional development programs and events in 2019, \$207,200 for staff salaries and benefits which includes time for planning and delivering events, and \$83,700 for overhead costs which includes items such as office rent and website redesign and maintenance.
- Excess of revenues over expenses will be invested in the future operations of MEIA, including delivering of future programs and events.

At December 31, 2019, MEIA has net assets of \$201,700, including cash of \$149,500. Consistent with previous years, the organization demonstrates prudent financial management to manage cash flow and maintain sufficient net assets to ensure the future operation of the organization. With the recent economic impacts of COVID-19, there is uncertainty of what the future may bring. However, MEIA will continue to focus on serving its members and meeting its mandate under the Sector Council Program while managing its finances.

Thank you to all our members and funding partners (specifically Manitoba Economic Development and Training) for continuing to support Manitoba Environmental Industries Association. We look forward to continuing to make a difference in the Natural Resources, Energy & Environment Industries.

At the time of writing, MEIA's financial audit is underway. Once complete the financials will be available upon request.



#### Introduction to Environmental Law

March 20, 2019

Participants learned about all environmental laws in Manitoba, with a specific focus on Environmental Assessment, the Environment Act, the Dangerous Goods Handling and Transportation Act and the Contaminated Sites Remediation Act. 11 participants attended this workshop.

#### Manitoba Association of Regional Recyclers Forum:

Educational Site Tour at City of Brandon's Recycling and Waste Management Facility

April 24, 2019

MEIA provided financial support for the educational site tour at City of Brandon's Recycling and Waste Management facility. These tours help Manitoba's waste management and recycling industry operators and planners learn about

best practices and operational procedures. 70 representatives from businesses and communities from across Manitoba attended.



#### Hazardous Waste Operations Emergency Response (HAZWOPER)

April 29 - May 2, 2019

The 4-day HAZWOPER course focuses on what Hazardous Materials are, how they are classified, what we need to think about in order to approach them, and how to evaluate and simply understand their toxicological effects. Delivered by Bart Taylor, a senior HazMat Specialist, this HAZWOPER training covers the clearly defined methods and protocols used by HazMat Specialists internationally to ensure that personnel operate in the safest possible manner. 14 participants attended this session.

## Emergency First Aid with CPR/Level C & AED

Various Dates

The MEIA, in partnership with Canadian Red Cross, continued to offer First Aid training in Emergency First-Aid w/ CPR Level C (3-year Canadian Red Cross Certification in First-Aid w/ CPR Level C and AED) This course provides the skills needed to recognize and respond to cardiovascular emergencies and choking for Adults, Children and Infants. It includes training in the use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) as well as basic first-aid. The course is Manitoba Workplace Health & Safety approved. 52 participants registered for First Aid training





#### SWANA Conference: Landfill Measurement

How do we Measure and Monitor Landfills

May 23, 2019

What are the latest approaches to measuring landfills? How can we analyse and utilize the data we collect? This session introduced technology, systems, and processes to monitor landfills and outline the importance of data in conserving airspace. MEIA provided support for this technical training session. The session was attended by 45 people.


# **Environmental Field Investigations: Soil Sampling**

May 29, 2019 University of Manitoba

The MEIA, in conjunction with the University of Manitoba developed this this one-day workshop providing hands-on field instruction in soil sampling and drill rig safety. Facilitated by Lena Andersson of Tetra Tech, students gained practical experience in aspects of environmental soil, water, and air sampling. Students also got an overview of provincial and federal regulations as they pertain to environmental site assessments, followed by hands-on experience with laboratory analysis of parameters commonly considered in Manitoba. 16 participants completed this course.

# Potable Water and Groundwater Sampling Workshop

May 30, 2019 University of Manitoba

The MEIA, in conjunction with the University of Manitoba developed this one-day workshop.

This program offered an introduction to typical impacts, sources and movement of impacts focusing on LNAPL and DNAPL considerations; regulatory review; groundwater well construction and installation considerations; groundwater well development purging and sampling protocols. The field portion of this workshop provided hands-on instruction on groundwater well development, purging and sampling. Course instructor was Laura Gallagher of Pinchn Ltd. 17 participants completed this course.

**Note:** The University of Manitoba offered 1.5 credit hours for taking this full day course, as well as the Environmental Field Investigation session noted above.

All participants were provided certificates validating participation in these programs.

#### Waste Diversion Workshop:

Opportunities & Benefits of Diverting and Recovering Clean Wood Waste in Manitoba

October 29, 2020

As part of the Manitoba Association of Regional Recyclers (MARR) annual Community Recycling and Waste Reduction Forum, MEIA hosted a half day workshop on an emerging waste diversion issue and opportunity. This year's workshop brought together representatives from companies and sectors that generate wood waste with experts on waste diversion, reuse and biomass energy recovery opportunities. The objective is to strengthen connections between the supply side and the demand side of wood waste management. The session was attended by 80 participants.

#### **Emerging Issues Conference**

December 5, 2019

The MEIA was pleased to partner with ECO Canada to host the 2019 Emerging Issues Conference. This full day forum focused on climate change and the potential impacts (and opportunities!) for important sectors of Manitoba's economy. Information sessions provided examples of practical measures municipalities and leading businesses are taking to address the impacts of climate change. And participants heard from diverse perspectives - A variety of stakeholders from across sectors engaged in practical discussions centered on climate actions in Manitoba. 120 delegates attended the conference this year.

#### **Highlights:**

Moderated panel sessions featuring representatives from Manitoba's largest sectors of the economy and key stakeholders discussing how climate change is expected to impact their constituents and how they are preparing to meet the challenges and compete in a changing environment.

Concurrent information sessions featuring leading experts, innovative businesses, and exciting new initiatives in the manufacturing, transportation, energy/buildings, and small/medium-sized enterprise sectors of the Manitoba Economy.

The keynote address was delivered by Dr. David Barber, Director of the Centre for Earth Observation Science (CEOS), and Associate Dean (Research), Faculty of Environment, the University of Manitoba. Dr. Barber has extensive experience in the examination of the Arctic marine environment as a 'system', and the effect climate change has on this system. Dr. Barber shared stories and lessons from his internationally renowned work on the effects and implications of a changing climate.

Compost Winnipeg was on site collecting food scraps to help us keep waste to a minimum.

We would like to give a big thank you to our Student Chapter Co-Chair Marissa Smirl for pairing up students with mentors and helping them find each other at the event. The Mentor-for-a-Day program at Emerging Issues has been a catalyst in linking students to their next employer and this year's turnout was the biggest we've ever had: 22 students matched with 12 mentors. Thank you to all the mentors for sharing your advice and wisdom with the students!

## Climate Smart Phase 2 Workshop #1

December 11, 2019

This first of 3 training workshops taught participants how to calculate their carbon footprint or greenhouse gas inventory. Methods were shared outlining the Greenhouse Gas Protocol, the International standard for carbon accounting developed by the World Resources Institute and the World Business Council for Sustainable Development. Participants mapped their business operations to identify where their emissions occurred and learned how to collect data from those activities using Climate Smart software provided.
