As the Executive Director for the Association, together with our amazing staff team, we are in the thick of it every day, our heads down, emersed in the moment and the tasks in front of us. So, when I stop to look behind me, or literally look inside this annual report, and see all that we accomplished I surprise myself on how much as an organization we actually accomplished.

In 2022, MEIA delivered 26 workshops, information sessions, and events with a total of 692 participants. That doesn't include the 600 people who attended our Emerging Issues Cleantech Conference where we showcased topics regarding green transportation, alternative energy, waste management and Environmental Social Governance. The conference was the highlight of the year in my mind.

It was the largest event ever held by MEIA and we received tremendous feedback response on how much attendees enjoyed it.

In the midst of all the planning for the conference and our regular fall programing, we also submitted our proposal for the next four year cycle of funding for our industry workforce development in the Natural Resource, Energy and Environment sector under the provinces Sector Council Program. I am very pleased to say that MEIA was successful in receiving this renewal for another four years beginning April 1, 2023. This puts us in a good position to continue the support for our members and the growth in our industry sector.

TREASURER'S MESSAGE

2022 was a year of significant growth for the Manitoba Environmental Industries Association (MEIA) as the organization continued to leverage its expertise to deliver additional programs and services.

MEIA continued its role as Manitoba's Sector Council for Natural Resources, Energy & Environment. As a Sector Council, MEIA received \$460,000 in funding from the Province of Manitoba Economic Development, Investment and Trade.

Key financial highlights for the year are as follows:

Total revenues for 2022 were \$1,199,000, consisting of \$460,000 from our core funding, \$437,000 from various grants and contracts, \$54,600 from membership dues, \$168,000 from professional development programs and events and \$80,000 from other grants and sponsorships.

Total expenses for 2022 were \$1,205,700 consisting of \$650,000 directly related to delivering professional development programs and events in 2022, \$380,000 for staff salaries and benefits, \$70,000 in contract staff for industry-specific expertise, and \$105,700 for overhead costs which include items such as office rent, marketing, and maintenance.

A small loss of \$6,700 is primarily due to ordinary holdbacks on government funding contracts that will be received at the end of these contracts.

At December 31, 2022, MEIA has net assets of \$231,000 including cash of \$1,388,000. Most of the organization's liabilities are due to deferred revenue, which is related to the strong cash position of the organization. Consistent with previous years, MEIA demonstrates prudent financial management to manage cash flow and maintain sufficient net assets to ensure the future operations of the organization. This on-going financial management approach has allowed MEIA to successfully deliver over \$425,000 in additional grants and contracts for program delivery that the organization did not previously offer.

Thank you to all our members and funding partners for continuing to support MEIA. We look forward to continuing to make a difference in the Cleantech, Natural Resources, Energy, & Environment Industries of Manitoba.





Registered Energy Advisor Program


