EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS MESSAGE

For this year's annual report, I've found plenty of stories to share about our organization's work and accomplishments. It's been a welcome challenge to capture everything. To help focus my thoughts on what to include, I asked myself, "What's the real purpose of an Annual Report?"

In my view, an Annual Report is our chance to shine a spotlight on what we've achieved in our industry through advocacy, promotion, and programming, showcasing our successes.

Reflecting on it, the Annual Report is also about transparency, trust-building, and showing the impact of our efforts.

Looking back at 2023, we surpassed our previous performance in program offerings, reaching approximately 1,286 participants and organizing and delivering 32 workshops, information sessions, and events.

One of the highlights was resurrecting MEIA's Charity Golf Tournament and organizing an Indigenous cultural-themed networking evening, which drew nearly 200 attendees. We followed that with our 600-person Cleantech Conference in November. Our increased membership, participation in programming, and expanded offerings are all thanks to our incredible team.

If I had to pick a standout moment from 2023, it would be renewing our Sector Council designation for another four years. This supports workforce development in Manitoba's Natural Resource, Energy, and Environment sector through Provincial Economic Development Investment and Trade. We also secured funding for Waste Site Operator training, enhancing our existing programs and ensuring MEIA's continued support to the waste management ecosystem.

While our sector faces significant challenges, they also present opportunities for our members and the association to make a positive impact on issues like carbon management, "forever chemicals," landfill operations, conservation, and sustainability. I'm excited about what lies ahead in 2024 and beyond.

TREASURER'S MESSAGE

TRAVIS TOET

2023 was another year of growth for the Manitoba Environmental Industries Association (MEIA) as the organization continued to leverage its expertise to deliver programs and services across the Natural Resources, Energy, and Environment industries.

MEIA continued its role as Manitoba's Sector Council for Natural Resources, Energy, & Environment. As a Sector Council, MEIA received \$580,000 in funding from the Province of Manitoba Economic Development, Investment and Trade.

Key financial highlights for the year are as follows:

- Total revenues for 2023 were \$1.68 million consisting of \$580,000 from our core funding, \$663,000 from various grants and contracts, \$65,000 from membership dues, \$242,000 from professional development programs and events and \$134,000 from other grants and sponsorships.
- Total expenses for 2023 were \$1.58 million consisting of \$1.0 million directly related to delivering professional development programs and events in 2023, \$408,000 for staff salaries and benefits, \$48,000 in contract staff for industry-specific expertise, and \$124,000 for overhead costs which include items such as office rent, marketing, and maintenance.
- MEIA finished the year with a net income of \$107,000.
- As of December 31, 2023, MEIA has net assets of \$359,000 including cash of \$1.54 million. Most of the organization's liabilities are due to deferred revenue, which is related to the strong cash position of the organization. Consistent with previous years, MEIA demonstrates prudent financial management to manage cash flow and maintain sufficient net assets to ensure the future operations of the organization. This on-going financial management approach has allowed MEIA to successfully deliver over \$663,000 in additional grants and contracts for program delivery.

Thank you to all our members and funding partners for continuing to support MEIA. MEIA continues to make a difference in the Cleantech, Natural Resources, Energy, & Environment Industries of Manitoba.
